## SREC Has Moved!

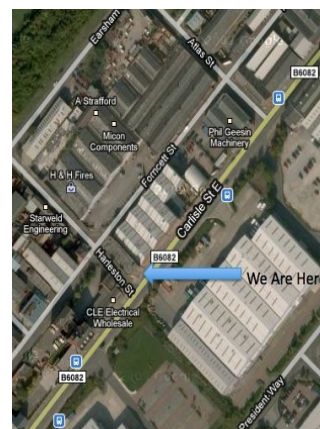

## SHEFFIELD CITY COUNCIL PUTS SREC'S ANTI RACIAL DISCRIMINATION CASEWORK SERVICE OUT TO TENDER

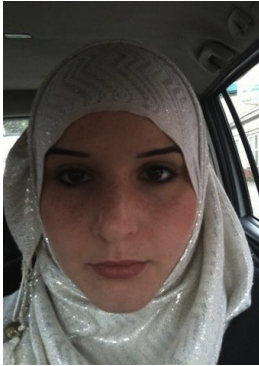
**Sheffield City Council** has recently released their invitation to tender for the provision of the anti racial discrimination casework service that SREC has delivered for over 40 years. The tendering opportunity has been released offering only a third of the funds previously allocated to deliver this fundamental specialist service.

After consultation with its members, partners and the public, the **SREC Trustees has agreed to submit a tender application to the Council** with the aim to continue to deliver the specialist anti racial discrimination service for the benefit of the citizens of Sheffield. Sheffield Racial Equality Council is the only organisation within Sheffield that has a long standing track record for providing an excellent quality anti racial discrimination casework service, providing information, legal advice and representation to victims of racial discrimination, harassment and victimisation. SREC also leads in building good race relations between people from different cultural backgrounds and working closely with others to create successful community cohesion and safety.

At this challenging time for Sheffield Racial Equality Council the Board of Trustees and the staff remain positive and optimistic about the future and would like to thank everyone for their valuable support
